Description: Thirty- or forty-hour training in client-centered, facilitative conflict resolution. Participants have the option to register for 30 hours if they are not interested in Court appointments, but desire to meet the International Academy of Collaborative Professionals standards (\*IACP MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR PRACTITIONERS ADOPTED JULY 13, 2004) and to enhance their delivery of Collaborative service by learning mediation skills. The forty-hour training is designed to meet the requirements of Rule 17-106(a) of the Court of Appeals in Maryland for those who would like to apply to be designated as a mediator under Maryland Rule 17-104(a)(2). Come learn skills in this skills-based training to assist those in conflict voice their views, consider the views of others, and work collaboratively to reach resolution together. Training format includes skills development, exercises, lecture, discussion and coached role-playing.
